

## Session 1 Handout

1. There are two ways in which God communicates to man:  
General revelation – see Ps. 19  
Special revelation – The Bible
2. The Bible is comprised of 66 books but it tells one story in four parts:  
Creation  
Fall  
Redemption  
Restoration
3. What does it mean that “God didn’t create you to get work done. He created work to get YOU done?”
4. After the fall, God asked Adam and Eve two penetrating questions:  
The question of proximity – “Where are you?”  
The question of authority – “Who told you?”
5. Why should the story of Noah’s ark be rated “R” (not suitable for children)?
6. Why did God confuse the languages of those building the Tower of Babel?
7. What did God use to illustrate to Abraham how many descendants he would have?
8. How many years were Abraham’s descendants held captive in Egypt?
9. What annual feast is still practiced by Abraham’s descendants to commemorate the act of applying blood to the doorposts of the Hebrew’s homes in Egypt?
10. Two of the most beautiful words in the Bible are “but God.”  
Eph. 2:4 says we were dead “but God” made us alive.  
Ro. 5:8 says we were without hope in the world “but God” demonstrated His love for us in sending Jesus to pay the penalty for our sin and set us free.
